

Auditioning for SSYC:

Auditions are made by appointment held in the spring, winter, and the end of summer each year. The audition itself is a short one-on-one time with one of our directors to assess their basic music knowledge and aptitude. Some musical exercises include:

- Echo a rhythmic clapping pattern
- Echo a melodic sing pattern
- Sing, "Happy Birthday," "Silent Night," or "America" (My Country Tis of Thee)

There is a follow-up meeting with the student's parents to review the expectations and responsibilities as a SSYC member. The director will then determine which choir appropriately fits their ability.

Tuition

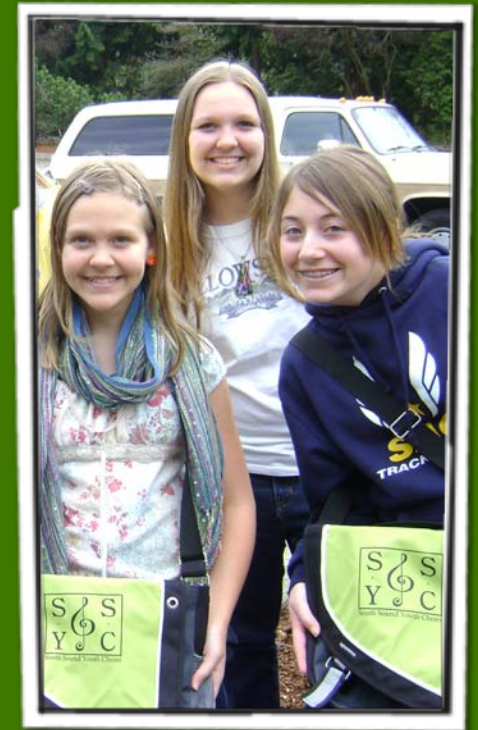
Tuition is \$45.00 per month (Oct to June) and due at the first rehearsal of each month. Tuition discounts are given to families with multiple children enrolled.

What Singers Can Expect from SSYC:

Chorus (Grade 3 to 5) Level 1

Our training choir provides a fun and rewarding first experience of being in a choir. Singers begin reading rhythm and melodic patterns based on the Kodaly's system. This choir performs twice a year.

Honor Choir (Grade 5 to 7) Level 2

The next level choir begins more difficult repertoire and student sing in two or more parts. Honor Choir students learn basic sight-reading skills as well as strengthen their vocal abilities. This choir performs twice a year.



Concert Choir (Grade 6 to 8) Level 3

In this auditioned choir, students begin to prepare themselves for entering the Academy Choir. Student fine tune their musicianship by working on advance music theory, and improving their sight-singing abilities. Most songs are in 3 parts and are in many foreign languages. The individual voice is strengthened through group vocal training and solo singing opportunities.

Academy Choir (Grade 8 to 12) Level 4

Students in this choir consist of our most musically accomplished students. They perform throughout the year and at many different venues. Nearly all students are proficient music readers and self-sufficient musicians. Academy students will also participate in national and international concert tours.
